ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Application for admission to 4 years B.A. 1st Semester Courses are invited usually in the month of June. The candidates are to apply in prescribed form or (Online Mode) provided along with the prospectus on payment of Rs. 150 in Cash from the office of the Kherkata College.

The applicant who is eligible for admission into the HS 1year and. B.A. 1st semester course, must be accompanied by self attested copies of the following.

- (a) H.S. (10+2) Examination Marksheet and passed certificate.
- (b) Two copies of recent passport size photograph signed by the candidate on the front side.
- (c) One stamp size photo in proper dress for the identity card.
- (d) Self attested copy of caste certificate (where necessary).

Admission to the college is made strictly on merit and is governed by the college admission rules and subject to the approval of the principal. Original certificates and marksheet shall have to be produced for verification at the time of admission. The

scrutiny of forms and selection of candidates will be made by a selection Board on the basis of college's rules & regulations.

There is provision of seats for students belonging to SC, ST and OBC/MOBC categories as per Govt. Rules.

NOTE:

- *Mark-sheet and certificate should be produced in original for verification at the time of Admision.
- *Irreqular students shall submit relevant certificate / affidavit along with the application form for the gap period.
- * Incomplete application form will not be accepted.

Dibrugarh University Regulations for Semester System:

- (a) Dibrugarh University introduced Semester System for the B.A. Programmes in 2010 which is of three years duration, distributed in six semester. The regulations came into effect from the Under Graduate Academic Session 2011-2012.
- (b) Academic Schedule for the B.A. programmes in the semester system is administered by the Academic Calender of the Dibrugarh University published for every session.
- (c) Structure of Course of the B.A. programme. All B.A. programmes shall have the following components:
 - * Compulsory Courses: These courses are compulsory for all students of the programmes concerned.
 - * Major Courses: Major Courses shall be chosen by the students. The courses shall be optional and non-mandatary.

ATTENDANCE:

*A student who has less than 80% attendance shall not be pérmitted to sit for the End-Semester examination in the course in which the shortfull exists: provided that it shall be open to the university to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons on recommendation of the Head / Director/ Co-ordinator of the Departmental / Centre on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

* The principal of the college with recomendation of the Heads of the deptt. shall announce the name of all students who shall not be appear in the End-Semester examination in the various courses due to non-fulfillment of the criteria of the internal assessment and attendance will be send a copy of the same to the university.

EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION:

(i) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least

- two times during each semester.
- (ii) There shall be 20% marks for the internal assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (iii) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

- * In internal assessment different tools like objectives tests, Home assignment, paper presentation etc. shall be used.
- * The student shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. The students shall compulsory attend internal assessment, failling which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A student could not be repeat In-semester examination.

END-SEMESTER EXAMINATION:

There shall be one End-Semester Examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the courses. The End-Semester Examination is normally a written / Project work / dissertation.

- * The controlar of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the date of the end semester examinations and other procedures as per DU Rules and Academic Calender notified by the University.
- * Normally, the End-Semester Examination for each course shall be of three hours duration.
- * Setting of question papers, modertion of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks etc. and announcement of result, shall be governed by the DU examination ordinance year of 1972.

RESULT AND PROGRESSION:

- (a) A candidate shall be declared as passed a course provided he/she secures-* At least 30% marks in each course in the end semester examination. At least 30% marks in each course in aggregate in the in-and end-semester examination.
- (b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he/ she passed all the courses of a semester independently.
- (c) The marks of in-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- (d) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end

semester examinations up to sixth semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course (s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable.

- * A candidate shall be entitled to a maximum of three chances to clear a course.
- * If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semester, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/her results shall be announced only after he/she clears the courses of the previous semester.
- (e) A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within Five (5) years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- (f) Since the semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- (g) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the Six-Semester Degree B.A. programme provided he/she has passed all semester degree B.A. programme is showing in the table.
 - * A student, who secures 60% and above marks in all the courses individually in all the semesters shall be declared have passed with First Division (in case of the students pursing general programmes) with distinction or First Class (in case of the students pursing Major speci ality programmes) with distinction.

Newly admitted students shall have to be registered under the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council or Dibrugarh University as the case may be.

All are mandatary.

STUDENT'S UNION:

Student's Union of the college is a elected body to uplift various cultural and sports activities among the students of the college. Secretaries elected by the students manage union functions under the guidance of respective teacher In-charge appointed by the principal.

GENERAL RULES AND DISCIPLINE:

- * No student can take any other full time course concurrently apart from the course of study in the college. Violation of this will lead to disciplinary action.
- * Students who fail to the attend 75% of the classes will be declared non-collegiate and allowed to sit in the examination only on payment of a fine. If he/she fails to attend 60% of the classes will be declared as dis-collegiate and debarred from appearing in the examination.
- * Student shall maintain perfect silence in the classroom and refrain from demonstration or disorderly behaviour.
- * Mobile phones are strictly prohibited inside the classroom and examination halls.
- * The college authority declared sewing of tobacco and battlenuts (pan-tamul) and taking of liquor in college campus as prohibited activity.
- * The following activities are treated as serious offence by the college authority:
 - Ragging of any type.
